[5.6.2] Does your university as a body have a policy of non-discrimination for transgender people?

NCUT maintains a **policy of non-discrimination for transgender individuals** as part of its commitment to fostering a **gender-equal, inclusive, and respectful educational environment**. The university ensures that all members of the community—regardless of gender identity or expression—are treated fairly and have access to equal opportunities.

Non-Discrimination Policy for Transgender Individuals

1. Protection Against Discrimination

- Equal Access: Transgender students and staff are granted equal access to education, employment, facilities, and resources.
- Non-Discriminatory Policies: All internal policies, including those related to admission, employment, and promotions, are inclusive of transgender identities.

2. Respect for Gender Identity

- Use of Preferred Name and Pronouns: The university respects the name, pronouns, and gender identity expressed by individuals in all official interactions and communications.
- **Gender-Neutral Facilities**: NCUT provides **gender-neutral bathrooms** and promotes the availability of facilities that are safe and accessible for all.
- 3. Anti-Harassment and Support Mechanisms
 - Zero-Tolerance for Harassment: NCUT strictly prohibits bullying, harassment, or discrimination based on gender identity or expression.
 - **Support Services**: The university offers **counseling services** and resources to support the well-being of transgender students and staff.
- 4. Inclusion in Gender Equality Education
 - Awareness Programs: The Gender Equality Education Committee integrates gender diversity education into its activities to raise awareness about the experiences and rights of transgender individuals.
 - **Training for Staff and Students**: Professional training programs include **topics on gender identity and inclusion**, ensuring that all community members are informed and respectful of diversity.

 - Alignment with National Laws: NCUT follows Taiwan's progressive policies, including the Gender Equality Education Act and other guidelines, which explicitly prohibit discrimination based on gender identity.

- Workshops and informational sessions are held to address any concerns and promote acceptance of these inclusive facilities.

- NCUT continuously updates and refines the design and facilities based on user feedback to ensure they meet the needs of all individuals.
