[5.6.6] Does your university as a body have women's mentoring schemes, in which at least 10% of female students participate?

The stereotype that women are less rational and logical than men, while having stronger emotional and lyrical abilities, has long permeated both academic and professional settings. This misconception has often contributed to the underrepresentation of women in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields. Recognizing the need to address this disparity, Taiwan has taken significant steps to promote gender equality in the sciences.

Taiwan's Commitment to Women in Science

Since 2017, Taiwan has recognized February 11 as the "International Day for Women and Girls in Science" (International Women in Science Day in Taiwan). This observance aligns with global efforts to promote the full and equal participation of women and girls in education, training, employment, and decision-making in scientific fields. The aim is to eliminate discrimination against women and to foster an inclusive environment where women can thrive in science.

Nationwide Initiatives to Promote Women in Science

Across Taiwan, universities and high schools have actively participated in showcasing the scientific and technological talents of female students through various events and activities. These efforts are not confined to urban centers but extend to regions like Changhua and Penghu, ensuring widespread impact. One notable initiative is the "Taiwan Female Scientists Award," which began in 2008. This award recognizes and encourages women in science-related industries by honoring their achievements and contributions through outstanding awards and rookie awards.

NCUT's Role in Encouraging Women in Science

At National Chin-Yi University of Technology (NCUT), the commitment to increasing female representation in STEM is evident through initiatives like the "Women's Science Day Study Camp." This annual event is specifically designed to engage high school vocational female students, providing them with opportunities to explore science through lectures, hands-on experiments, and interactive activities.

The study camp aims to spark interest in scientific subjects and encourage more women to consider careers in science and engineering. By creating an inclusive and supportive environment, NCUT hopes to inspire young women to pursue their passions in STEM and contribute to the development of women in science.

NCUT's Commitment to Gender Equality: Educational Initiatives and Lectures

1. Women's Film Festival:

- **Objective:** The festival is designed to help students establish diverse gender concepts and broaden their perspectives on intimate relationships.

- **Activities:** Film screenings are followed by discussions that encourage students to reflect on the themes presented and how they relate to gender equality. These discussions are a platform for students to explore different gender identities and roles, promoting a deeper understanding of the complexities surrounding gender.

2. Emotional Lecture Series:

- **Upcoming Topics:** The next lecture series will focus on current affairs and related cases that address gender equality laws, workplace equality, and emerging digital gender issues.
- **Goals:** By discussing these topics, NCUT aims to equip students with knowledge about gender equality in various contexts, including legal, professional, and digital spaces. The lecture series seeks to foster a well-rounded understanding of gender issues and promote a culture of equality on campus.

3. Consultation and Guidance Sessions (2020-2022):

- **Sessions Held:** Over two academic years, the consultation and guidance group conducted a total of 5 sessions, comprising 60 classes.
- **Participation:** These sessions attracted 517 participants, reflecting significant engagement from the student body.
- **Additional Activities:** Other administrative units at NCUT also organized various activities aimed at reinforcing the concepts discussed in these sessions, further integrating gender equality into the campus culture.
